Cleaning and televising of sanitary sewer mains: Randy Pope presented the lowest bidder for the project to Hydro-Kleen, LLC (Watertown, SD) at the base bid \$33,675. After much discussion, Jerry made a motion to go forward with the project, and Christ seconded the motion and all ayes. They would like to have a change order to add 4<sup>th</sup> Ave SE and golf course road, which would add about \$5000. This project will be 14-2. We would use the street fund at this time. ElRoy made a motion to enter into an agreement for engineer services with Interstate Engineering, Inc. Linda seconded the motion and all ayes. Contract shall not exceed \$6000.

**Law Enforcement Report:** 158 hours were worked in September in Gwinner. There were 5 arrests, 4 criminal investigation, 31 traffic warnings and 24 calls of service. There has been someone in the school zone 2-3 days a week, and the radar signs have been a big help on slowing down the traffic during the school hours.

**Building permits:** John and Patti Thompson built on a deck on the south and east side of the house at 120 Main St S. After a very long discussion, the council would like have Jeff drawn up a letter for them to get the neighbors to sign off on stating the deck can stay as it stands. The site line is not clearly defined on this block. (EIRoy/Jerry) Jodi Lindvall wanted to let the council know that Jay Enderson will be the contractor for the crawl space and Jay hopes to start on it October 20<sup>th</sup>. She said she really wants to get in before winter. The house will be angled on the lot so it faces southeast. Keith McFarland to move in trailer into his trailer court; it must be 10 feet from the property lines. (Jerry/EIRoy) Council will look into another trailer house that was pulled into town without a building permit.

Auditor Report: Employee salary and insurance was discussed for 2015. Health Insurance will be paid at 100% for Dennis, Dave, and Jeffery and all employees will receive a four percent raise. (Chris/Jerry) New rates for water, sewer and garbage were discussed, but tabled until next month.
